Latin America and the Caribbean is a region of

- enormous potential:

- Unprecedented macroeconomic and political stability
- It is likely that economic growth in LAC continue to outpace that of the most developed economies in the world
 - Even if the latest growth estimates are more modest than in past years
- Vast natural resources
 - Raw materials
 - Renewable energy sources
 - 40% of the world's biodiversity is concentrated in LAC
- Substantial social progress
 - Emergence of a large middle class it is expected to continue growing strongly
 - Huge progress on other social dimensions, e.g. healthcare
- Increased competitiveness
 - Development of financial markets
 - Emerging internationalization of LAC firms: The "multilatinas"

- substantial challenges:

- Less favorable external environment
 - Lower growth in demand for commodities
 - Monetary policy in the USA and EU
- 177 million people in the region still live in poverty
 - Highest inequality worldwide
- Pressure on urban centers and ecosystems
 - 80% of the region's population lives in cities, it will be close to 90% by 2030
 - Deforestation
- Huge infrastructure needs: Need US\$170 250 B p.a. until 2020
 - Electricity demand x 2 by 2030, prices unsustainably high
 - Low broadband penetration
- Deficit in skilled human capital
 - Low quality of training
 - Pervasive informal economy


